

Beginning February 15, **individuals 12 and older** will need to show proof that they have received either two doses of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine or one dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine to enter certain indoor venues.



Beginning March 1, all students eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine that has been fully approved by the FDA (currently, 16 and older) **must be immunized against COVID-19**. Applies to DCPS, charter, independent, private, and parochial school students.

By Tuesday, February 15,
all DC Government employees must provide proof that they are up to date with their COVID-19 vaccinations, including a booster when eligible.

Funding Alert: Bridge Fund Application Now Open!

Through the \$40 million Bridge Fund, brick-and-mortar restaurant, retail, and entertainment businesses still grappling with the COVID-19 public health emergency can get **grants of up to \$100,000** to cover rent, payroll, inventory, and operating expenses. The program will prioritize businesses that have not received federal relief funds and microbusinesses with \$2.5 million or less in revenue.


