# Where We Are Today

Metric	Where we are today (data as of 7/22/20)
<b>Community Spread</b>	
Sustained decrease in community spread	Increasing trend
Low transmission rate ( $R_t$ )	$R_t = 0.93$
<b>Testing Capacity</b>	
Low positivity rate	2.9%
<b>Health Care System Capacity</b>	
Sufficient health care capacity without surge	81.4%
<b>Contact Tracing</b>	
Make first contact attempt for new positive cases within 1 day of notification	100%
Make first contact attempt for close contacts of new positive cases within 2 days of identification	95.3%
Percent of positive cases from quarantined contacts	2.9%

# NEW MAYOR'S ORDER: REQUIREMENT TO SELF-QUARANTINE AFTER NONESSENTIAL TRAVEL

Beginning Monday, July 27, anyone coming into Washington, DC from a high-risk area who was not traveling for essential activities will be required to self-quarantine for 14 days.

The order **excludes Maryland and Virginia**. DC Health will publish a list of high-risk areas on [coronavirus.dc.gov](https://coronavirus.dc.gov) and update it every two weeks.

If people come into Washington, DC **from a high-risk area**

because they are **returning home** after performing an essential duty

because they are coming here in order to **perform an essential duty**

they should only leave home/where they are staying in order to perform essential activities.

**High-risk areas** are locations where the seven-day moving average of daily new COVID-19 cases is

**10 or more per 100,000 people.**

Today, we sent a letter to colleges and universities regarding their plans for reopening and further guidance around:

- Testing
- Contact Tracing
- Student Behavior
- Isolation and Quarantine

Students arriving from high-risk areas will be required to **self-quarantine for 14 days.**

For now, no additional arts and entertainment waivers will be issued.




